GATHERING

'Can God set a table in the wilderness?'

The people asked; they put God to the test. Then God commanded the clouds above and opened the doors of heaven. God rained down manna for them to eat and gave them the bread of heaven. Mere mortals ate the bread of angels, which God gave them in abundance.

Heaven's bread, the perfect meal for our deepest hunger and hope.

While graciously providing, God tested them back. God told them to take no more than enough; to store nothing of what they had gathered; to share freely; to trust and take time to rest from their work; and to place some of the manna at the centre of their common life so that they would always remember. A bit like car boot communion, this 'bread of the presence' in their Ark of the Covenant was their constant, portable, spiritual reminder of their story and the source of their freedom.

CONFESSION

Forgive us our sins. We confess to God how we have turned from love and trust:

Brief pause for reflection.

Forgive us our sins.

We confess to God how we have hoarded abundance:

Brief pause for reflection.

Lead us not into temptation.

We confess to God how our consumption wounds the earth:

Brief pause for reflection.

Deliver us from evil.

We confess to God how we have capitulated to the powers of the world, the rules of the market:

Brief pause for reflection.

The kingdom, the power and the glory are yours.

Forgive in us what has gone wrong, Restore in us what is wasted. Reveal in us what is good. Turn us back to you, and nourish us with better food than we could ever buy:

Your word, your love, your inspiration, your daily bread for our life's journey, in the company of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

THE WORD

Through the prophet Isaiah, the Lord says:

On this mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare for all peoples a feast of rich food, a banquet of well-aged wines – the best of meats and the finest of wines. God will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; God will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord will wipe away the tears from all faces, and take away the disgrace of

the people from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. In that day they will say,

This is our God, the one in whom we trusted, the one who saved us. This is the Lord for whom we waited. Let us rejoice, and be glad.

Thanks be to God.

THE TABLE

Blessed is our God, both guest and host, who sets the table with bread and wine, and invites us to share in communion.

Let us hear the story of how it began: On the night that he was betrayed, Jesus sat at the table with his friends. Just as he did when feeding crowds in the wilderness, he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'Take, eat, this is my body.' Later he took a cup of wine and gave it to them, saying, 'This cup is the new relationship with God, made possible through my death. Drink, all of you, to remember me.'

So now we follow Jesus' example and command, taking bread and wine together.

In these, Jesus has promised to be present; through these, we become one with Christ; in Christ, we may be made whole.

Beauty of self-giving, beauty of forgiving.

Winds and rain have caressed it.

Christ often blessed it.

Be loving when you drink wine.

Thank you, God, for bread, for wine,
for love and for your promises,
and for people to share them with. Amen.

We come forward, one by one, to take bread and wine.

God of all people, our God:

Take what we have and what we hope for,
to make this a world where all people find good news.

Help us share in the work of your kingdom,
until the new earth is created among us.

LEAVING

In gratitude for this moment, this meal, these people, this transformation, we offer ourselves to you.

Ask much of us, expect much of us, enable much by us, encourage many through us, that we may live to your glory, both as inhabitants of the earth and as citizens of the commonwealth of heaven. Amen.

May the God who sets a table in the desert; who feeds multitudes from a child's generosity; who feeds us with his own flesh and blood, nourish and sustain us, and continue to transform us into the very image of Christ: The Bread of Life. We go in peace to love and feed the world:
